### *Provincial Orthodox Championships*

It is with great pleasure that the Ontario Amateur Softball Association would like to announce the return of Orthodox Softball Provincial Championships in 2011.

After an 11 year absence the Orthodox Provincial tournament will take place in Toronto in the former municipality of the City of Scarborough at L'Amoreaux Park.

The tournament will be a 3 day event starting on the Friday evening of July 29, and finishing up on Sunday July 31st.

There will be 2 different divisions for teams to enter at this event.

The first will be a true Orthodox division that will play under Softball Canada rules with 1 exception. The pitching distance will be moved back to 46 feet.

The top 2 teams from this event will also have the opportunity to represent Ontario at the Eastern Canadians Orthodox Championships in September being held in Quebec.

There will also be a new Modified division Championship for teams to enter introduced this year.

The modified championship is a reflection of the style of Orthodox rules that are currently being used in several leagues across the Province of Ontario. There are over 200 teams at present playing in leagues using these similar rules. The OASA recognizes their version of Orthodox softball and wants to start a new Provincial Championship for this group in 2011.

The modified Provincial Championship will be played with several rule variations from the normal Softball Canada Orthodox rules. The most notable ones include unlimited substitution, 65 feet distances between bases, relaxed uniform requirements and no stealing until the pitch crosses the plate. A complete list of the rule variations will be supplied upon request.

The entry fee for each division at this Provincial Championship tourney is 350 dollars with a 3 game guarantee.

## **OASA Western Springboard**

On a day that looked more like November 16 instead of April 16 the Springboard clinic was held at the Rudy Brown Rural Development Centre Gym. This huge gymnasium was able to accommodate the wonderful turnout of ball players.

In the morning session we had 64 in attendance.

The morning session started with warm up exercises for everyone. After the warm up the players were divided into 8 groups. There were four groups that started with hitting, and the other four groups went on to the fielding and throwing sessions.

After everybody had a chance at batting, fielding and throwing, the can-pitch instructors worked with the pitchers and catchers. While the pitchers and catchers were getting instruction the positional players went to another gym to work on base running techniques.

During this time the coaches were in session learning about the coaching aspect of the game, as well as the new rules for this year.

The afternoon session had 29 participants starting with warm ups then dividing into pitchers, catchers and positional players.

The positional players were given instruction on base running techniques, hitting and fielding. The pitchers and catchers were given instruction on their trade then they moved on to the hitting aspect of the game.

The coaches had an informative session in the afternoon as well.

## **OASA Eastern Springboard**

The OASA's second annual Eastern Springboard was held in Belleville on Saturday, April 30. Participants ranging in age from 8 to 16 included local kids as well as those who travelled from as far away as Stittsville and Athens. These young players honed their **throwing** and **fielding** skills under the tutelage of Scott Searle, Head Coach of the University of Ottawa Women's team. Joe Lewis, Coach of the 2010 Junior Men's Canadian Fast pitch Champions, guided the players through drills in **hitting** and **base running**. Softball Ontario's Master Pitching Instructor, Bryan Brooks, was on hand to offer an introductory version of the Softball Canada **CAN pitch** program. Helping out these lead instructors were members of the Napanee Express Junior Men's, Junior Ladies and Bantam Boys teams.

While the players worked in the gym, coaches and parents took the opportunity to attend two sessions in the classroom: an **Ask the Umpire** session with Zone 9 Umpire-in-Chief Chris Lamer and a Softball Ontario **Long Term Player Development** session with Scott Searle, a graduate of the National Coaching Institute.

Thank you to OASA volunteers Leanne Ashbridge, Sheryl French, Keith Fleming and Dave Northern who did an excellent job in keeping the event running smoothly. A special thank you to Terry Pearce of Belleville Minor Ball for his help to acquire and set up the facility.

### **Softball Canada's LTPD and the OASA**

Softball Canada has undertaken an ambitious Long Term Player Development Plan in an effort to save and energize our game of softball. Outcomes from this initiative will have numerous effects on the OASA game in our province. Beginning in 2012 at the Midget and Junior division level the age limit will drop back to 18 and 21 years respectively. At the Pee wee and Bantam level open Canadian Championships are being promoted. The Pee wee Girls in Quebec 2010 first tried the new format. Bantam Boys could be next in 2011.

In the Squirt and under divisions it is suggested that Provincial Championships give way to regional tournaments with jamboree format and skills challenges. Softball Canada would like to see these events allow for open participation and more games guaranteed. Softball Ontario has gathered a group of interested Ontario associations to see how the LTPD plans could be implemented in our province. Three members of your OA Minor Committee are on this committee.

The Minor Committee, with the support of the host centres and participating teams, hope to implement some of the LTPD suggestions at the Mite and Junior Mite OA tournaments this summer. The OA Divisional Coordinators will be working with the teams to help the host offer some fun and exciting modifications to our basic Mite and Junior Mite tournament formats to encourage maximum participation and fun for our young ball players.

Working together with our affiliated centres the OA hopes to offer an exciting new twist to our 2011 Mite tournaments. Change in our game is on the horizon. Good luck towards a fun and competitive fastball season in 2011.
